



Livestock LSU% by species in Hungary, 2020

Martin Wille, a state-secretary in the German agricultural ministry, said that waiting 10 or 15 years to discuss CAP reform is too long. "I believe we should start now in the context of the mid-term review." He said that the candidate countries should be adopting a reformed acquis and not the present CAP, which will inevitably change in the future.

How it started?

- Agricultural negotiation results (included in the Accession Treaty)
- Grape marc or grape marc spirit may be replaced by the designation of Pálinka solely for the spirit drink produced in Hungary (fruit spirit is a bit different story if includes apricot).
- Geographical designations for Hungary.

CAP parameters for Hungary in the Copenhagen Agreement (Crop production)

- GOP plants regional yield (t/ha): 4,73 (second highest among the 10 NMS)
- GOP plants base area (ha) 3 487 792 (Established on 1997-2001 averages. Excluded (December 31, 2000): permanent pastures, permanent crops or trees, or was used for non-agricultural purposes)
- Durum wheat traditional area: (ha) 2 500 (0,07%) supplement payment
- Durum wheat non traditional area (ha) 4 035 special aid
- Legumes (ha) 1 954
- Tobacco total (t) 12 355
- Sowing seeds (t) 7 235
- Rice: support 163,215 EUR/ha (lowest); Base area: 3 222 ha (0,74%)
- Fruit net weights fresh fruit processing treshold: Tomatoes: 130 790 tonnes (1,5%); Peaches: 1616 tonnes (0,29%); Pears: 1031 tonnes (0,98%)

CAP parameters for Hungary in the Copenhagen Agreement (Livestock production)

- Slaughter premium
 - Bulls, steers, cows and heifers: 141 559
 - Calves (1-7 months old): 94 439
- Special beef premium: 94 620
- Suckler cow premium: 117 000
- Ewe premium: 1 146 000
- Milk
 - 1 782 650,000 tonnes deliveries (1,31%)
 - 164 630,000 tonnes direct sales (5,96%)
 - Restructuring reserves to be applied from 2006 42 780 tonnes

Derogations for all

• Total amount of support for investment in agricultural holdings, expressed as a percentage of the volume of eligible investment, shall be limited to a maximum of 50 % and, in less favoured areas, 60 %. Where investments are undertaken by young farmers, these percentages may reach a maximum of 55 % and, in less-favoured areas, 65 %.

Derogations for all

- Support for investment shall be granted to enterprises which have been granted a transitional period after accession in order to meet the minimum standards regarding the environment, hygiene and animal welfare.
- Areas at risk of forest fires in the rural development plans

Derogations for Hungary

- RD plan covering a 3 year period (starting from January 1, 2004).
- Direct payment schedule of increments (percentage of applicable level):
 - 25% in 2004
 - 30% in 2005
 - 35% in 2006
 - 40% in 2007
 - 50% in 2008
 - •
 - 100% from 2013

Complementary national direct payments

 Up to 55% of the level of direct payments in 2004 financed from the RD funds and national funds

• 2005: 60%

• 2006: 65%

• From 2007: 30% (only from national funds)

SAPS at the start

- Minimum size: 0,3 ha
- No obligation to produce
- Good agricultural condition to be maintained
- Original intention: 2008 would be the last year of Single Area Payment Scheme application.



Income support details, EU-27 (2019)

- 6 064 820 farmers receive CAP income support
- The average income support per beneficiary: 6 610 EUR
- Ratio of holdings not benefiting: 41%






Speed of transition toward a flat rate payment




Selectiveness of beneficiaries



Redistribution of support between farmers




National CAP tailoring


EU member states - comparison


CAP payments in Hungary in the 2014-2020 period

- 12,3 billion EUR




Share of supported hectares in UAA (%)




Total output per farm in the EU-27 and in Hungary between 2016-2020, FADN (EUR)


Comparing EU-27 average gross farm income to that of Hungary, 2016-2020, FADN (EUR)


Average farm capital value in the EU-27 and in Hungary between 2016-2020, FADN (EUR)

Institutional involvement

- Hungarian State Treasury as Paying Agency (legal successor of the former Agricultural and Rural Development Office).
- County or district government agencies.
- County Directorates of the National Directorate General for Disaster Management.

CAP in Hungary between 2023-2027

- 5 million hectares UAA
- Objectives for the Hungarian agriculture:
 - Double the size of irrigated area (from 2 to 4 per cent)
 - Adding 28 000 new jobs (?)
 - Increase agricultural export (10,624 billion euro in 2021) value by higher value added products
 - Increasing the share of the food sector in the GDP (?)
 - Increasing the competitiveness of Hungarian enterprises.
 - Encouraging producers' integration and cooperation.
 - Innovation.



Facts

- December, 2020: Official Journal -Regulation of the EP and the Council (2020/2093).
- KAP ratio decreases, but remains over 30% of the budget.
- 336,374 billion EUR (on 2018 prices).
- 40% of CAP resources is to allocated to environment and climate protection goals, biodiversity goals (2024 - 7,5%, 2026 - 10%)

Financing 2023-2027 - HUNGARY

- I. Pillar: 8,702 billion euro
- II. Pillar: 3,010 billion euro
- II. Pillar + NGEU: 3,308 billion euro
- CAP TOTAL: 11,938 billion euro
- CAP TOTAL+NGEU: 12, 237 billion euro

Changes compared to 2014-2020?

- Yes.
- Direct payments and market measures: 2,13%
- Rural development: -12,88%
- Rural Development + NGEU: -4,24%
- CAP TOTAL: -5,11%
- CAP TOTAL+NGEU: -2,74
- (worse if calculated on 2018 prices)

Reaction

- National complementary aid allocated through the RD pillar has been raised significantly to 80%, starting in 2021.
- 4 265 billion HUF.

HUNGARY CAP STRATEGIC PLAN

- Allocation plan in the first pillar:
 - BISS: 3,886 billion euro (1418 billion HUF); 157,94 euro/ha
 - **CRISS**: 663,43 million euro (242 billion HUF); possible argument on the isufficient capping!
 - **CISYF**: 93,5 million euro (34,11 billion HUF); 157,33 euro/ha and up to 300 ha (118 000 ha/year)
 - Eco-Schemes: 995 million euro (363,1 billion HUF); 80,85 euro/ha
